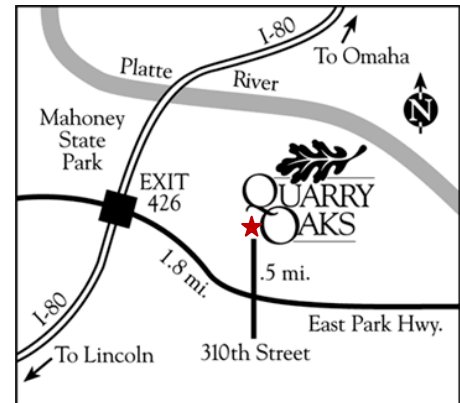

**FROM LINCOLN:** Get on I-80 going east. Continue east to the 426 exit (South Bend/Ashland/Louisville exit). Take exit and at stop sign go right (south-southeast) on Hwy 66 (East Park Hwy). Continue approximately 1.8 miles to Quarry Oaks Drive and turn left (north). Watch for signs on Hwy directing you to the course. Continue north on Quarry Oaks Drive to the course. You can unload clubs on the east side of the clubhouse and then park south of the clubhouse.

**FROM OMAHA:** Get on I-80 going west. Continue west to the 426 exit (South Bend/Ashland/Louisville exit). Take exit and at stop sign go left (south-southeast) on Hwy 66 (East Park Hwy). Continue approximately 1.8 miles to Quarry Oaks Drive and turn left (north). Watch for signs on Hwy directing you to the course. Continue north on Quarry Oaks Drive to the course. You can unload clubs on the east side of the clubhouse and then park south of the clubhouse.

**About Quarry Oaks:** Quarry Oaks opened in 1997 with the goal of creating a premier golf course in Nebraska that fits into the inherent natural beauty of the scenic Platte River Valley and embraces the namesake quarry, characteristic of the limestone-entrenched terrain of the area. The course has been ranked the #1 public golf course in Nebraska by *Golf Digest* and includes an 18-hole championship course with a multi-tiered practice range with target greens, a sand and chipping practice area, a practice green, and a recently-expanded clubhouse. The course also integrates and emphasizes natural features of the area and employs a variety of practices to conserve resources.

**About the LPRCA & the Water Quality Open:** The Lower Platte River Corridor Alliance (LPRCA) was formed in 1996 between 3 NRDs and what is now 6 state agencies, each having a stake in management and protection of the Lower Platte River Corridor. Stretching 110 river miles from Columbus to the mouth near Plattsmouth, this "Corridor" includes the Platte River, adjoining public and private lands in the 100-year floodplain, and the adjacent bluffs and uplands. The area plays host to a variety of interests including what the LPRCA has identified as the "8 Reasons to Protect the Lower Platte River". These reasons include: Public Water Supplies, Recreation, Hunting & Fishing Resources, Housing Development, Mining, Tourism, Wildlife Habitat, and Agriculture. Each of these "8 Reasons" will be incorporated in with the demonstrations this year

With goals to promote understanding of the Lower Platte River, support efforts to achieve comprehensive and coordinated land use efforts, and facilitate cooperation between the public and private sectors, the LPRCA has developed and utilized a variety of tools including educational programs such as the **Water Quality Open Golf Tournament**. Held every year since 1997, this event blends an outdoor recreational activity with passive and active educational approaches to raise awareness of the importance of water resources in the Lower Platte River Corridor and beyond. Participants range from the general public to legislators to resources managers. Information and outreach is apparent at all turns of the tournament including displays at the clubhouse, trivia signs on the greens, presentations prior to the event, and demonstrations on specific holes. The tournament also allows participants to co-mingle and meet new people with different ideas and perspectives. For the fourth year in a row, we forged a unique partnership with **NEBCO**, parent company of Quarry Oaks, to increase visibility of the event and show how public-private partnerships can be a great way to spread the message of conservation as well as demonstrate it in action.
